In the beginning of the month, Dawn took us to the garden so we could dig up potatoes! We talked about some of our favorite foods that come from the garden, like pears and apples for example.



Also on the topic of farms/gardens, we played with barns and farm animals, sang songs about some of our favorite farm animals, and even practiced making animal sounds. We even got to put real straw in our barns.
