Children do need to be symptom-free for 24 hours before returning to school when they do come down sick. Thanks for keeping our school healthy!

We had a comment/suggestion from one of our parents that I wanted to address. The suggestion was that all staff park on the street to make more parent parking available. First off, thanks for your suggestion, as a general rule staff should not be parking in our lot due to this reason. We do have some exceptions, our openers/closers (for safety), staff with children, and administrative staff (emergency purposes). We realize our parking lot is small and do appreciate everyone working together to make it safe, efficient, and functional.
