## **Eco-Healthy Child Care**<sup>®</sup> (EHCC)

is a national program that partners with child care professionals to eliminate or reduce environmental health hazards found in child care facilities, thus improving the environmental health of children. EHCC supports child care providers as they make simple choices that benefit the health and well-being of all children in their care. The program offers training, technical assistance, resources, marketing and an endorsement. By reducing exposure to toxics, the program creates healthier environments in and around child care facilities, and in doing so, it creates healthier kids.

EHCC covers the following content areas:

Pesticides and Pest Prevention Air Quality ♦ Household Chemicals Lead ♦ Mercury ♦ Radon ♦ Art Supplies ♦ Furniture and Carpets Plastics and Plastic Toys Arsenic: Treated Wood and Water Recycling and Garbage Storage Education and Awareness

Specific objectives include:

- Educating child care professionals on how to provide environmentally healthy settings and services.
- Assisting facilities in making changes in practices and purchasing.
- Promoting endorsed facilities to parents via our Website, earned media and paid advertisements.

EHCC emphasizes low-to no-cost solutions to common environmental health hazards and empowers providers to maximize their children's potential. EHCC is made possible through generous support from funders including: the Cedar Tree Foundation, the Kresge Foundation, the W.K. Kellogg Foundation, HUD, CDC and EPA. EHCC's 30+ member National Advisory Committee (NAC) supports the development and growth of this program. The NAC includes representatives from Child Care Aware of America, the Environmental Protection Agency's Office of Children's Health Protection, the National Association for the Education of Young Children (NAEYC), the National Head Start Association (NHSA), and the National Association For Family Child Care (NAFCC), among others.

## **Our projects include:**

**Child Safe Policy:** The nation's principal law regulating most chemicals was drafted more than 30 years ago and does not adequately protect human health. CEHN educates policy makers and engages health care professionals to assure that children are protected under this law and others.

**Communicating Science:** CEHN's "Children's Environmental Health Article of the Month" brings emerging science to broader audiences and highlights the science that supports increased protection of children in policy and practice. CEHN supports the creation and submission of review articles for peer-reviewed journals on pediatric environmental health topics.
